

IMMUNIZATION UPDATE 2011 Webcast

August 4, 2011, 9:00 a.m. – 11:30 a.m.

This webcast is CDC's annual update on the most recent and significant developments in the rapidly changing field of immunization. Anticipated topics include influenza, meningococcal, zoster, Tdap, and human papillomavirus vaccines. Other emerging issues will be discussed, including the latest information from the June 2011 meeting of the Advisory Committee on Immunization Practices (ACIP). The 2.5-hour broadcast will occur live from 9:00 am to 11:30 am PST. There will be a live question and answer session in which participants nationwide can interact with the course instructors via email and fax.
